7. Treasurer's Report – Anthony Pinho – Dolphin Rd

The Bank Balance as of 09/30/25 is \$7,958.69

- We took in \$165 in revenue coming from memberships and \$515 in donations from our first event.
- Expenses were \$233;
- \$150 for insurance; \$50 for food pantry; \$33 for taxes
- TBA Membership stands at 208, up 4 from last month. To close out memberships at 211.
- o Expense next month: Jingle Mingle \$800 for Jingle Mingle food vendor.
- o Nancy Peterson: Should we have a giveaway for members at the concerts.

Old Business:

- Spit of Land update Guaranteed 4.6 million for spit of land project. Approved 3/09/24. Public law # 118-42. May take a couple of years. It will go out to 1977 tide lines. Must be done by March 30 of 2027.
- Brian Martin working with CFO to add to next years budget to have a dedicated hot spot for Green Street Park. He will present to the CFO.
- Be aware of possible law change regarding building on Flood Plains to be passed by the NJ Governor as an Executive Order however, this has been pushed back to next year.
- Motion to repurpose grant from Pinelands to use for education in Tuckerton Elementary, all in favor, motion to approve. Two children at Tuckerton Elementary rec'd \$50 a piece to students who perform community service.
- Cris Mayor added businesses to our sign.
